## RIF Launches First Community Fundraising Campaign: Literacy Match Challenge

RIF is pleased to announce its first community fundraising initiative: **The Literacy Match Challenge Campaign.** 

This campaign will help fund RIF's annual "Spring Into Reading Is Fun" event for the next three years. At "Spring Into Reading Is Fun", held during a week in May, every first-grade student in Schenectady is gifted several new, age-appropriate books, a t-shirt, and a cinch bag.

Thanks to a generous grant from *The Wright Family Foundation*, every dollar raised by RIF will be matched, up to \$30,000. The \$30,000 funds we aim to raise (plus Wright's \$30,000) will cover the "Spring Into Reading Is Fun" event for the next three years. All donations are tax-deductible, and any funds raised in excess of the \$30,000 match will be allocated to RIF's general budget for books.
